

Professionalism: a necessary ingredient in a culture of safety.

<u>Disruptive and unprofessional behavior</u> that goes unaddressed poses a threat to patient safety by hampering development of a <u>culture of safety</u>. This study reports on how one academic hospital addressed this issue by developing a multidisciplinary code of professionalism accompanied by a dedicated hotline for <u>reporting</u> unprofessional behavior. All reported incidents resulted in a combination of feedback, coaching, or disciplinary action for involved providers. Introduction of the code and the reporting system was associated with a significant improvement in teamwork and communication, as measured by the AHRQ <u>Hospital Survey on Patient Safety Culture</u>. This study provides an approach for health care organizations to address the disturbingly common problem of disrespectful and hostile behavior in the workplace. Other approaches are outlined in a <u>PSNet perspective</u>.
