This review summarizes the literature on <u>safety walkrounds</u>, which broadly involve health care executives or senior managers visiting frontline staff and engaging in conversations about potential safety issues. Following <u>evidence</u> that walkrounds improved <u>safety culture</u>, this practice became widely endorsed by AHRQ and other leading health care organizations. However, this review includes a number of cautionary notes about the limitations of safety rounds and prior research on the efficacy of these programs. The authors outline evidence-based keys to successful implementation, highlighting that <u>failure to follow up</u> on concerns raised may actually erode, rather than enhance, safety culture. A past AHRQ WebM&M <u>perspective</u> by Dr. John Wittington stressed the importance of involving hospital leadership in quality and safety efforts.
