<u>Studies</u> have reached conflicting conclusions about whether the "<u>July Effect</u>"—the belief that inpatient mortality increases during the July transition—truly exists. This commentary describes how leadership, <u>supervision</u>, mentor–learner pairings, and communication enhancement can help to reduce risks in this period. The authors suggest that applying strategies from <u>aviation</u> to augment teamwork between interns and residents could be an effective improvement strategy.
