

## Improving Diagnostic Quality and Safety Final Report.

Although <u>diagnostic error</u> is a well-recognized source of preventable patient harm, <u>measuring</u> and mitigating diagnostic error remains challenging. This <u>National Quality Forum</u> report describes the development of a framework to assist with measuring diagnostic quality and safety. The framework outlines 3 domains and 11 subdomains for measuring diagnostic quality and safety as well as 62 prioritized measure concepts. High-priority areas for measure development include <u>timeliness of diagnosis</u>, timely follow-up of <u>test results</u>, communication and handoffs, patient-reported diagnostic errors, and patient experience related to diagnostic care. The committee also identified several cross-cutting themes and makes recommendations for researchers seeking to develop measures to improve diagnostic safety. A <u>PSNet perspective</u> discussed challenges and opportunities regarding diagnostic error.
