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[Physician burnout](#) has reached [epidemic levels](#). This systematic review examined whether resident physician burnout reduces [safety or quality of care](#). Burned out residents reported poorer quality and safety, but few studies corroborated self-reported errors with clinical outcomes or chart review. A past [Annual Perspective](#) explored the relationship between burnout and safety.
