Many states are implementing prescription drug monitoring programs (PDMPs) in an attempt to curb the ongoing opioid epidemic. This single-center study examined the effect of a New Hampshire policy that mandates clinicians use a PDMP and an opioid risk assessment tool prior to prescribing opioids. No impact was found on overall opioid prescribing rates. However, a recent <u>state-level analysis</u> found that states who implemented a PDMP had lower opioid prescribing rates compared to states without PDMPs. A <u>PSNet</u> perspective discussed the factors that contributed to the opioid epidemic and proposed solutions.
