In this systematic review, the authors synthesized evidence on the impact of <u>professional interpreters</u> on outcomes for hospitalized children from migrant and refugee families with <u>limited English proficiency</u>. The authors conclude that while video and in-person interpreters are more favorable for some outcomes, use of a professional interpreter of any mode was superior to the use of an ad hoc interpreter, or to no interpreter at all.
