

## Why test results are still getting "lost" to follow-up: a qualitative study of implementation gaps.

Inadequate follow-up of <u>diagnostic testing</u> can lead to <u>missed or delayed diagnoses</u>. Based on interviews with healthcare workers at Veterans Affairs (VA) facilities across the United States, this qualitative study identified factors contributing to lack of timely follow-up of abnormal test results. The most commonly cited factors included <u>trainee/resident</u> involvement, absence of a process to address incidental findings on imaging, lack of standardized <u>electronic health records (EHR)</u> and related tracking systems, and lack of updated patient and provider contact information. The authors summarize participant <u>recommendations</u> to reduce missed test results.
