Front-line workers (e.g., nurses and physicians) and <u>leaders</u> frequently perceive the safety culture in their organization differently. This study uses data from <u>AHRQ's Hospital Survey on Patient Safety Culture</u> (HSOPS) V.1.0 from 2008 - 2017 to compare leadership and front-line workers' perceptions of patient safety culture. With responses from 1,810 hospitals and more than 800,000 individuals identified as leaders or front-line workers, results show that leadership has a consistently more <u>positive</u> perception of patient safety culture, particularly on items related to managers.
